- **HOW:** We support our educators by providing hands on learning opportunities, provide inspiration, sharing stories, work side by side with educators to co-plan & Co-design lessons, leading professional learning. Loaning equipment & resources- SD23 has sets of robots to loan to schools to explore trying something new as entry point before schools commit to purchasing their own.
- Tobias is also member of <u>STEAM Ecosystem BC</u>, there are lots of community organizations working together to engage students, parents, and community in hands on STEAM learning activities
- Showcase STEAM events throughout the year; <u>First Lego League</u>, district <u>SumoBot</u> competition, and <u>Expo of Awesome</u>
- Why is this Important?
  - Many of our teachers don't have specialized backgrounds in science and technology, some are generalists, some are specialists, and at a district level we are working to support teachers develop and refine their pedagogy and their approach to design learning.
- We are sharing with COPAC today to bring awareness of STEAM to ignite and spark enrichment support for STEAM by volunteering or **through PAC financially supporting** STEAM activities and resources.

- Continue to grow as a district, with increase of 169 FTE students (however didn't meet our projected growth)
- Handful of staff affected in terms of position changes.
- 2024 School Opening Reports are posted to the school district website (part 1 and part 2)
- Couple of concerning events occurred within the community involving youth, while this didn't occur on school property-SD23 is working with school community and youth officers RCMP
- Tragic loss of an MBSS student, Post-Critical Incident Response team is working to support the school community.
- Groups from Europe, Switzerland primarily, to see the work SD23 does in Inclusive Education. We also had groups from Germany looking at how we implement inclusion teachers.
- Retirement announcement of Deputy Superintendent Terry-Lee Beaudry. Her last day will be December 31<sup>st</sup>. See <u>press release</u>

**Open Letter: Fund Portables, Build Schools, and Fix Education Funding –BC Families Demand Action** This letter will then be shared out via social media channels of various DPACs across the province and others from there. The intention is to demonstrate that BC parents are informed and paying attention to education this election. Anyone can sign the letter, it does not have to be a PAC or DPAC affiliation
